Jess was presented with her award by Rob Wilkinson, Chair of the Ryde Sports Foundation & Deputy Ryde Mayor Shweta Deshpande. Jess's win was the first time a Ryde Athlete had won the major award of the night since Amy Winters won it in 2003/04.

Also recognised on the night with the Ryde Sports Foundation, Contribution to Sport Award was club legend, life member and coach, Ross Forster.

Registration information 2023/24

What is Ryde Seniors?

Ryde Seniors is part of the Ryde Athletics Centre and is affiliated with Athletics NSW (ANSW). We have existed for over 70yrs in various forms.

We provide membership to all ages right through to our Masters athletes.

What does it cost to join Seniors?

- ANSW Youth (ages 8-12yrs) \$40*
- ANSW Juniors (13-16yrs) \$40*
- ANSW Juniors (17-19yrs) \$140
- ANSW Open Age (including Masters) athletes \$190

Ages are as 31st December 2023

*If your child is not registered as a Ryde Little Athlete there will be an additional \$50 club membership fee added to the above fee to ensure they are a financial member of the Ryde club & eligible for relay teams, trophies, and grants.

We recommend that any athletes under 11yrs who are thinking about joining, speak to their coach to discuss whether it would be a good way to supplement their Little Athletics. Over that age, Ryde Seniors believe ANSW offers some great events to challenge athletes to achieve their best.

What events can I compete in?

There are loads of events that you can compete in over the season. ANSW offers events most Saturdays or weekends and there are sometimes mid-week competitions including;

- Allcomers competitions & Treloar Shield are open to all Athletics NSW registered athletes.
- Specialised meets that may be for middle distance events, throws, jumps or pole vault meets.
- State Championships including NSW Juniors& NSW Opens, the State Combined Championships and, the NSW All Schools Championships.
- The ANSW State Relays (18-19 November) are a great competition to get together with other members from Ryde Seniors and form teams. We select our teams on ability not age and so get a great mix of athletes to enter as many teams as we can.

 Ryde Senior Club Championships - held twice a year and the only day that Senior Club records can be broken. Our first Championships day is Sunday 15th October.

Where can I find more information on what events are being offered?

You can check the ANSW Calendar - (https://www.nswathletics.org.au/events/list/

on their website.

Ryde Seniors will also keep you up to date on what is offered via email, Facebook updates & our newsletter, Footprint.

ANSW competition lets you choose the events you want to compete in. At many ANSW meets you will compete in seeded events so you will always be challenged. ANSW events provide the gateway to competing at our national championships.

What about Opens and Masters Athletes?

As well as offering membership to Little Athletes, Ryde Seniors is a way for parents to join athletics. Open membership is available from age 20 and for Open athletes aged over 30, competition via master's championships is also offered via State and National Championships as well as at ANSW Relays and during winter, in Cross Country events.

The NSW Masters Championships usually held in February saw ten Ryde Masters take to the track and field in 2023, many competing for the first time. They came home with 8 gold, 6 silver and 2 bronze medals.

Masters' competition is based on 5 yr. age groups - e.g., 30-34yrs, 55-59yrs so you compete against people of similar age.

The Australian Master Championships is a fantastic opportunity to pit yourself against athletes from around the country, in what is a friendly, encouraging atmosphere. In 2023, our Ryde Masters came home with 16 medals. Seven of those athletes had never competed at National masters before.

Ryde Social Athletics will also continue this season as well with athletes registering with ANSW as Community Athletes for \$50 for the season. As ANSW members Social Athletes will also be able to compete to break records at the Ryde Senior Club Championships. If they decide to upgrade their membership to a full Masters athlete, the \$50 already paid will be credited against the upgrade.

The Australian Cross Country Championships

Over winter many of our middle distance runners continue their running, off track in cross country, and there are lots of results on the following pages as to how many of our runners went at various schools and ANSW championship events.

The culmination of the Cross Country season is the Australian Cross Country Championships which were held in the Stromlo Forrest, ACT on the 26th August. Ryde Athletes, **Adam Bruntsch and Benjamin Woodhouse** were both selected in NSW teams to run at this event.



Adam competing in the 8000m U20M event placed 25th in Australia in a time of 26min 41sec.





Benjamin competed in the 4000m U16M event and was 23rd past the post in a time of 13 min 15secs.

Both boys battled the rough and tumble of cross country running with Adam spiked and Benji taking a fall but both continued undeterred. Well done!

The NSW All Schools Track & Field Championships is one of the biggest carnivals of the year and is open to all high school student.

The Primary School Challenge is a new event open to 10-13yr old primary school students. Entry fee for the Primary School Challenge is \$27.50 per event.

For NSW All Schools the entry fee is \$37.50 per event for ANSW members (eg Ryde Dual registered athletes) or \$50 if you aren't an ANSW member. Anyone registered with ANSW for the 2022/23 or 2023/24 season can access the discount entry fee. Please make sure you log in as a member to get the discount. If you weren't registered in 2022/23 then register now for the new season to access the discount using the QR code on top right.

The Championships will be run at SOPAC over two weekends: For 16-19yrs & the Primary School Challenge 23rd-25th September (entries close 8th September)

For 12-15yrs 6th-8th October (entries close 22nd September)

Winter competition results Athletics NSW Cross Country Relays

The Athletics NSW Cross Country Relays were held at Upjohn Park on Saturday 3rd June and Ryde Seniors had four teams competing, including our first ever Masters Cross Country team.

Our U16 Boys 4x3km team saw **Axel Bruntsch** get the boys off to a good start with a time 10m 22s. of Making his Ryde Seniors debut, **Owen Smith** was one of the youngest in the U16 event at just 12yrs of age and kept the boys in the hunt with a leg of 11m 53s. Great to see **Benjamin Woodhouse** back out running, and Benji ran the third leg and was the fastest third leg runner with a time of 10m 27s. **Luke Moscos** brought the team home in a time of 11m 46s for 5th place overall in 44m 30s

Our U20 team was led off by **Adam Bruntsch** whose time of 9m 31s was the team's best. **Keir Barnes** was also making his Ryde Seniors debut. A talented 400m/800m runner, Keir was stretching out

to the longer distance and stopped the clock at 11m 34s. **Isaac Siebert** took over and finished in 10m 55s with **Nicholas Woodhouse** bringing the team home in 11m 19s for 9th place at State for 43m 20s overall.

Illness and injury meant we had to shuffle our Women's team around and made the decision to run an Open Women's team to give all those who were interested, a run. Our women's open team saw another two of our new Seniors recruits, **Christine Phillips** and **Tinarra Wickey** out in the Ryde colours.

Georgia Phillips led off the Open Women's team 4x4km team in a time of 16m 47s. Georgia passed the baton to her mum, **Christine** who finished in 20m 10s, followed by **Zara Pawsey** in 20m 24s and **Tinarra** in 21m 13s for 13th overall in a time of 1hr 18m 36s.

Our first Masters Cross Country team really enjoyed the runs, once they had rested up a bit, with the boys all keen to have another go next year.

In the 40yrs+ 4x 4km event, **Jon Baker** led off with a time of 18m 57s. **David Teo**, running his first track leg for Ryde, handed over the baton on in a time of 19m 54s to **Puspesh Puspesh** who was to run our fastest leg, a time of 17m 12s and Nick Pawsey brought the team home in a time of 18m 14s for 1hr 14m 18s overall and 7th place.

Athletics NSW Cross Country Championships

The NSW Cross Country Championships were held at Tapitallee on 17th June and Ryde had 5 runners out on the course.

Georgia Phillips placed 11th in the U18W 4000m event in a time of 16m 19s. In the U16M 4000m, **Benjamin Woodhouse** placed 10th in 13m 48s and **Julian Smith** was 21st in 14m 56s. **Adam Bruntsch** took on the 8000m U20 run and placed 10th in a time of 27m 21s. **Christine Phillips** rounded out our runners with a 1st place in the 50-54yrsW 6000m in a time of 29m 57s.

Mitchell wins his second ANSW medal at the Team Walks Championships

Whilst Ryde couldn't quite get enough members to compete as a team at the ANSW Team Walks, **Mitchell McCarthy** continues to show some excellent form in his first season as a Senior athlete.

The ANSW Short Course Cross Country was held at Dapto on the 8th July and Ryde was represented by five athletes.

Oliver Smith competed in the U18M 4000m event and placed 15th in a time of 14m 06s.

In the U15M 3000m **Ben Proszenko** (below) came home in a time of 11m 52s for 26th place.

Axel Bruntsch was 17th in the U16M 3000m event in 10m 11s. Not far behind in 21st spot was **Julian Smith** in a time of 10m 32s.

In the U20M 6000m **Adam Bruntsch** had a good finish to place 9th in the State in a time of 19m 36s.

NSW All Schools Cross Country

The NSW All Schools Cross Country was held at Eastern Creek on the 21st July. Representing their schools and school representative pathway were seven Ryde Senior Athletes. Most of these athletes have competed in up to three qualifying events to make it through to this elite level, in what is one of

the biggest cross country state carnivals in Australia.

Benjamin Woodhouse placed 6th in the 15yrs Boys 4000m in a time of 13m 24.7s. Ben's result has qualified him for the NSW All Schools team to compete at the Australian All Schools Cross Country Championships in late August in the ACT.

Ben had had some interesting training sessions getting ready for All Schools whilst holidaying overseas including running along the base of the Eiffel Tower, around St James Park, alongside Lake Geneva and canal side in Wales. Sounds like the preparation worked out well!




Owen Smith competed at his first high school state cross country championships and placed 56th in the 13yrs 3000m in a time of 12m 31.6s.

Brothers **Julian and Oliver Smith** had both again qualified for All Schools and Julian was to place 33rd in the 15yrs 4000m in 14m 43.4s. Oliver placed 21st place in the 17yrs 6000m in 22m 14.6s.

Isaac Siebert was 41st in the 16yrs 6000m in a time of 23m 00.05s.

Amongst our female athletes, **Georgia Phillips** placed 22nd in the 17yrs 4000m (16m 50.6s) and **Ella McGregor** came home 40th in the state in a time of 18m 48.0s in the 15yrs girls 4000m.


