PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to welcome our invited guests, life members and members to our 25th Annual General Meeting.

St. George has had another very enjoyable and successful season. Again our numbers were very high with over 500 competitors. Because of the large number, it makes it very difficult to run all of the events on Friday night. This season we split two of the age groups - U/7 Boys and U/10 Girls into two groups. This was done on their track grading and although some people did not like it at first, once up and running it helped tremendously, especially at field events.

I think it might be about time to start thinking of another Centre for the St. George area so that we can keep our numbers at a manageable level and give all children a fair go.

During the season our Secretary, Kay Culkin, resigned and I would like to thank her for her help over the years and the great job she did as Secretary and wish her well for the future. Many thanks to Julie Upton who has stepped in as Secretary and is on a fast learning curve for the job as Secretary.

I also wish to thank Hurstville City Council for all their support and help with Olds Park. At the start of the season they surveyed and marked a new track for us, saving a lot of weekend work for the committee. The new track has proved popular with the children and it shows in their results during the year. Special thanks to Andrew Sharp from the Engineers Dept. for his efforts in organising this.

Thanks must also go to Life Members, Lindsay Watson and Ian Sheerin, for their input into the new track. Again we had the senior athletes competing with us on Friday nights and although few in numbers, it does fill the gap between Little Athletics and the senior interclub. Thanks to Arthur Peek for the amount of work he puts into this and for all the training of our athletes.

State Relays were held for the first time at Homebush, using both tracks with an increased number of teams entered. It made for a very long but enjoyable day. We had some excellent results and the children really enjoyed competing at the new venue. Thanks to the efforts put in by all coaches and managers of our teams.

After the Christmas break we were into the end of the season with Zone, Region, State, State Multi-Event and Preston carnivals. Our athletes all did very well with 30 progressing through to the State Championships held at Homebush. We came away with 6 GOLD, 10 SILVER, AND 8 BRONZE medals, making it an excellent result. We also had 3 relay teams in the finals. To all those who competed at State, congratulations. To the other children, keep on trying. I am sure you will get there. With such fine performances it made it very difficult to select our Centre Awards this season.

Congratulations to Kylie Di Rosa for her State Record in the 200metre Hurdles at the Regional Carnival. Unfortunately she was ill and was unable to compete at State - next year Kylie.

This year I accompanied our Preston Team to Victoria. A great weekend was had by all including the parents who joined us. The children all enjoyed their plane flight and saw a lot of Melbourne in the short time they were there. This was the 24th year of our Preston visits and Bev and Fred Scott, who organised the original visits, joined us for the weekend. Even though there is a lot of fundraising to be done by the children, it is a wonderful experience and I hope it continues on for many more seasons.

While in Preston we saw some very good electronic timing equipment, and although very expensive, it would help us enormously on Friday nights as you only need one person at the end of the track and a recorder - no timekeepers or place judges! This would free up parents to work in other areas. We are looking into this with the possibility of purchasing it before the start of next season.

Our Canteen and BBQ position was not filled again this year and I must thank Jannette Hachem for taking over and doing a wonderful job during the season. As the Canteen and BBQ are our main sources of fundraising, I would hope that someone will take it on for the coming season.

One area that needs looking into is our training sessions. Trish tried very hard to co-ordinate this and we had coaches available, but not many of our children took advantage of this. If anyone has any suggestions, please let the Executive know so we can try something else.

Thanks also to John Burne, our Zone and Region Co-Ordinator, who has once again organised two very well run carnivals and thanks for your support and help to our Centre.



I have truly enjoyed my second season as Registrar but all good things must come to an end. I wish the incoming Executive Committee all the best for next season.

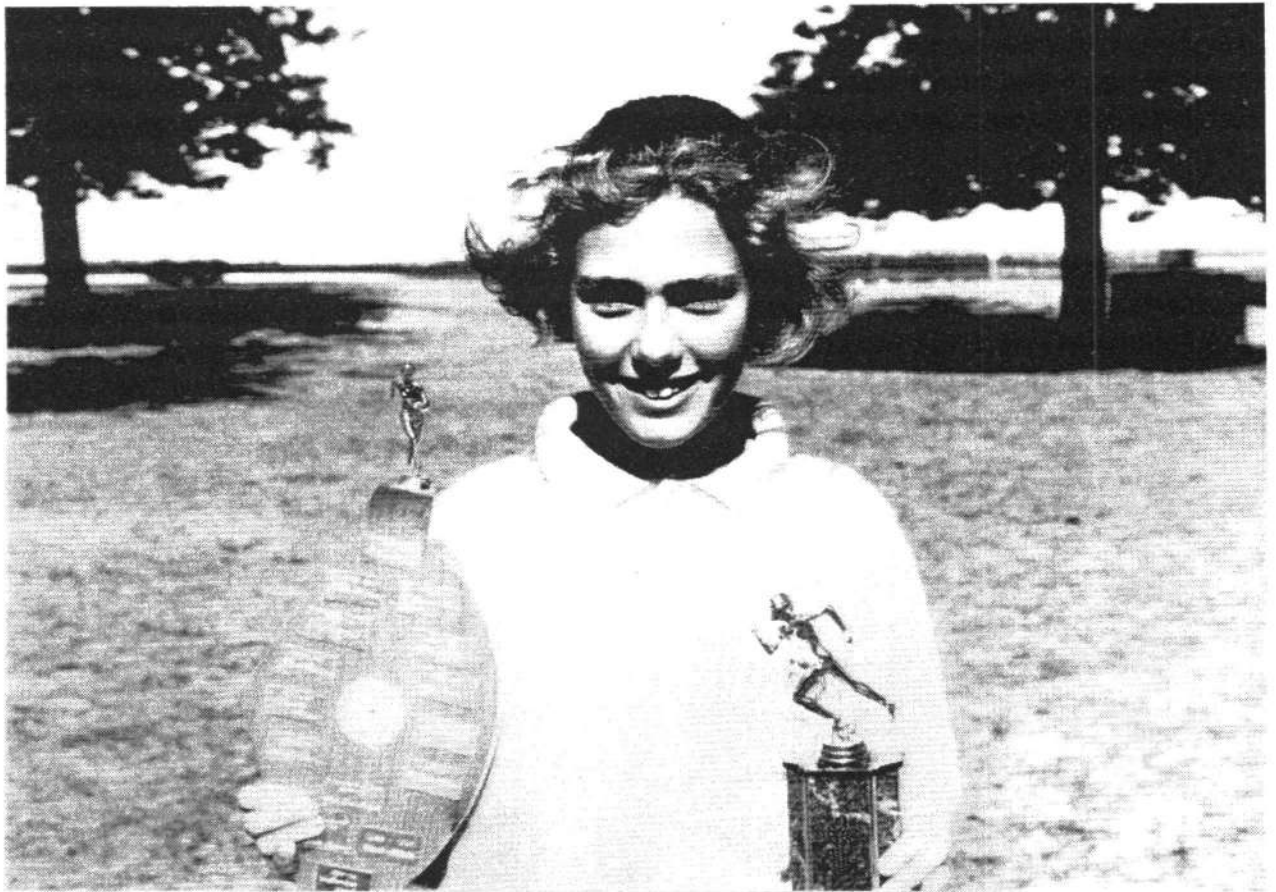

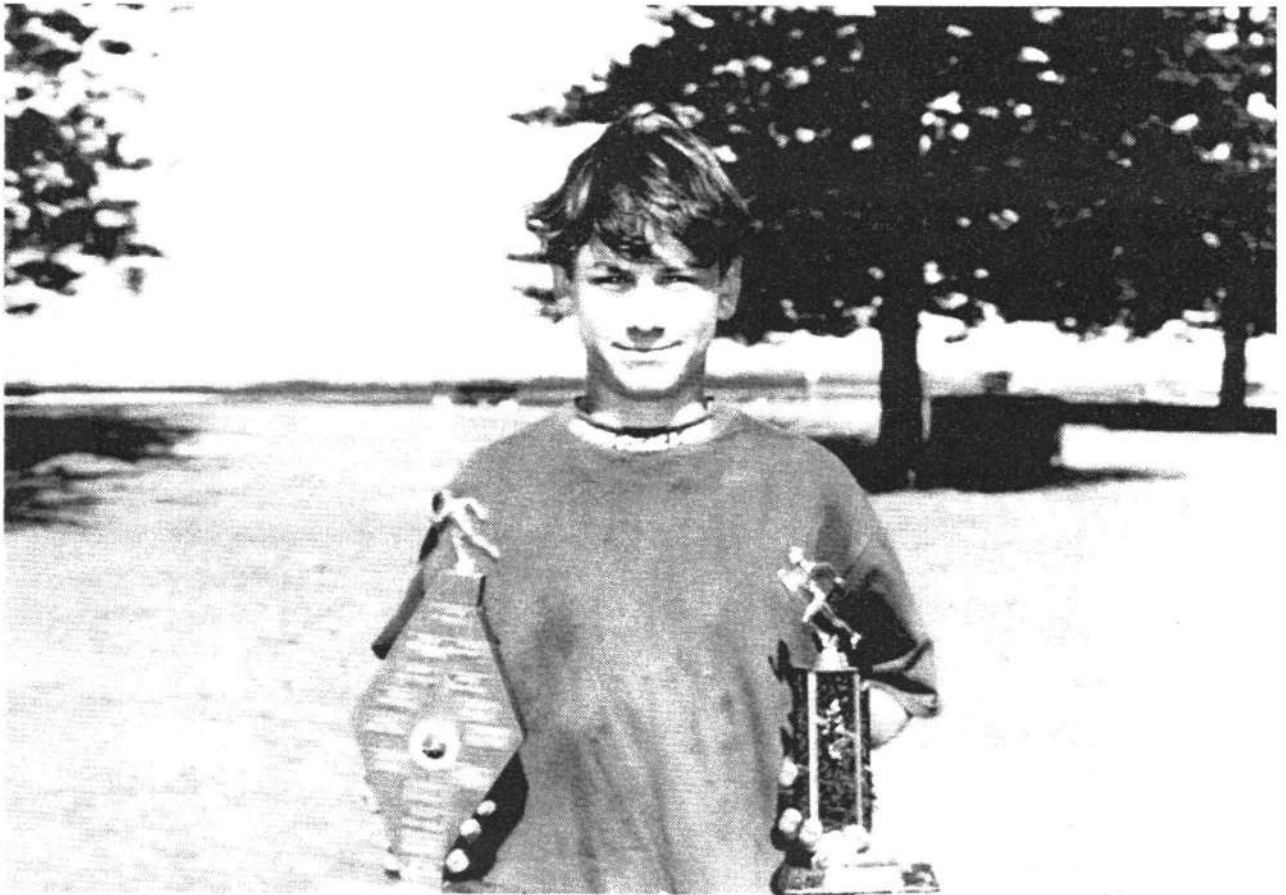
BRYDAN LENNE (U/11)

ST. GEORGE'S BASIN "DRAGON DERBY" 29TH OCTOBER, 1995, NOWRA SHOWGROUND

This was our 2nd year attending the Dragon Derby and we had 28 athletes competing with great success. Nearly all children from St. George won medals. U/14B Stephen Eccles and U/11B Harry Harris set two new records each, to go with the many other records we hold at this carnival.

St. George looked after the place judging at the Dragon Derby and it is the only carnival where every parent wants to help. They fed us and gave us drinks all day. The hospitality was great and this is a carnival I can highly recommend.

SCAMPER 12TH NOVEMBER, 1995

The Scamper was held at the Sydney International Athletic Centre, Homebush. This year we had 14 families participate with great success. This is a non-championship day for our U/6's, U/7's and U/8's to experience running on a top class track. All our children did well and were a credit to our Centre.

STATE RELAYS

26TH NOVEMBER, 1995

As in the past, the State Relay Championships proved to be a very successful and exciting day for St. George L.A. Centre. The new Homebush Sydney International Athletic Centre was a new experience for the majority of the athletes and parents. (In general it is an excellent facility, but obviously had its limitations when attempting to cope with a crowd of 12,000 which, incidentally, was a new ground record!)

St. George proudly sported a team of 120 athletes who represented the Centre in all but two events. All athletes performed to the best of their ability on the day with many personal bests being recorded. Under often trying conditions the athletes were a credit to the Centre and a big THANK YOU to each and every team member.

This season was an outstanding one for many athletes. Records were broken regularly throughout the season, particularly in Long Jump and Hurdles. 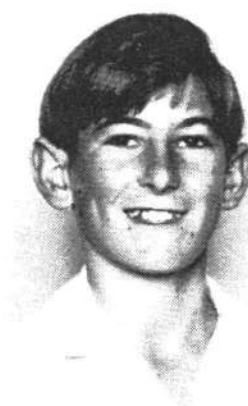
ENCOURAGEMENT AWARD - BOY

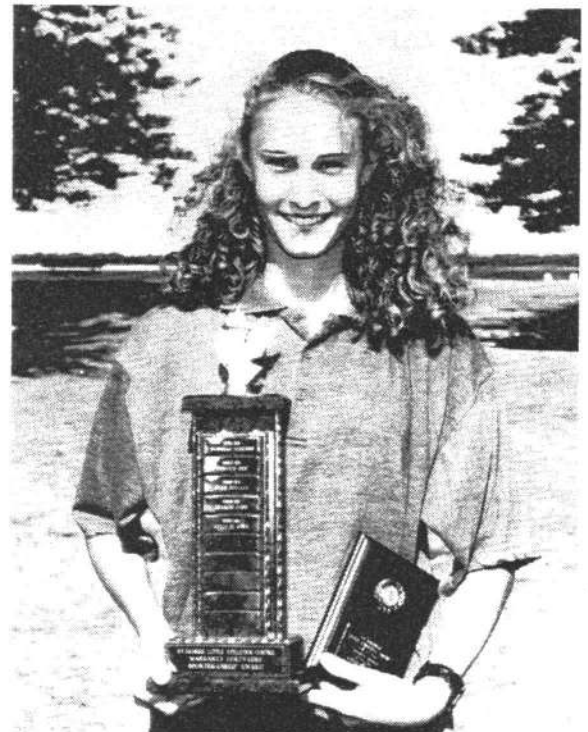
SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD
