The 2001/2002 season was another challenging, exciting and very rewarding season for our Club. We only experienced one cancellation for wet weather this season and that came from the Council. This year we introduced the ASAP Program for our Under 6 athletes. Our thanks to Kathy Hamer for her work, all the children enjoyed learning skills to help their athletics. This year we purchased starting blocks for our athletes and they are all very comfortable in competing with these. Two new shade shelters were purchased and are used each Friday night as well as appearing at many competitions. A new communication system has helped to run our Friday nights more efficiently.

Our first thankyou is to all our athletes. Who else are we here for? All athletes competed in all disciplines in safety. This year saw many athletes achieve excellent results, not only many personal bests but a number of ground and centre records along the way. St George athletes competed at State Relays, State Multi, Zone, Region and State Carnivals, as well as a number of other Carnivals, in particular the Dragon Derby at St Georges Basin. This year it was our team that travelled to Preston and returned with the Cup.

The season finished on a high note at the State Competition with our 24 athletes receiving 5 gold, 8 silver and 6 bronze medals. Our athletes competed in 45 events

achieving top 8 place in 32 of these events. Many personal best performances were achieved that weekend. Congratulation to all our athletes. Our red and white featured in many disciplines over the weekend, however our throwing and distance runners featured strongly this year. A highlight for our club was the selection of Lauren Bartlett to the NSW State Team. As an Under15, Lauren was selected on her performance at State Multi's. Congratulations Lauren.

Our thanks to all the parents who assisted on Friday nights, setting up and putting away, judging, timing, measuring, serving in the canteen and at the BBQ and all the other tasks required to run a large centre like St George. We cannot function as a centre unless we all volunteer and work together. Thankyou helpers.

Our thanks also to those officials who although they have no children competing at St George assist us each Friday night. Gil Baes, Jan Dodd, Katie Dodd, Ray Horton, Roger Malcolm, Peter Rook and Ben Tinker.

Hurstville Council, and in particular Andrew Sharpe, have again been particularly helpful this season. Last season several years' damage to our track was repaired. Our ground is now in much better condition and as a result Council marked our track regularly for us throughout the season. We look forward to continuing to work side by side with the Council as next year we trust that our ground will be resurveyed and our long/triple run ups resurfaced..

Thankyou also to Penshurst RSL who have again provided us with the use of their facilities this season.

Finally thankyou and congratulations to the Executive and Committee of St George for another successful year. We extend particular thanks tonight to both John Dodson and Julie Upton whose children have now finished Little Athletics. Gil has contributed to St. George Little Athletics in many other ways, often those that are not normally noticed, like assisting with repairs of equipment and preparations for other carnivals.

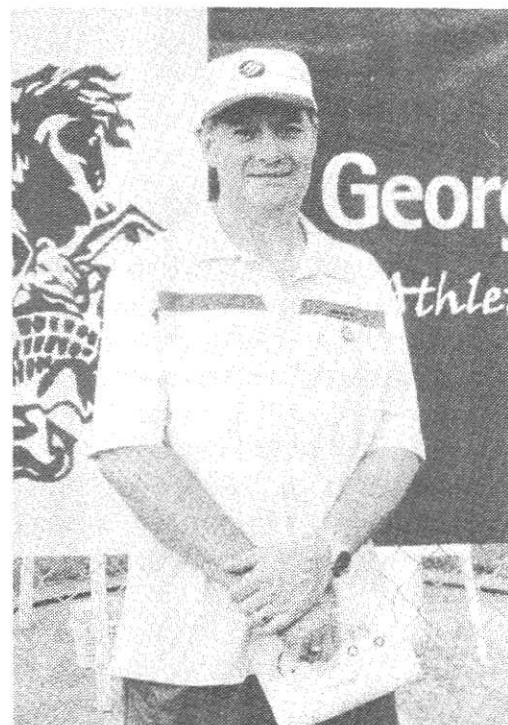

That person was Gil. He has been the Chief Timekeeper on the Circular Track (Short Distance) for as long as most of us can remember and started seemingly before time began. Perhaps as a timekeeper Gil had actually been in a Time warp?

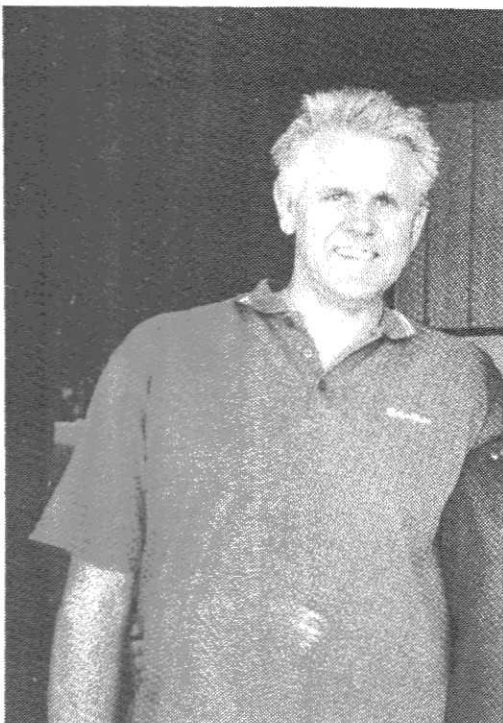
Gil has often been involved in marking the track during his membership. He has spent, along with others, many a Saturday, Sunday, or Public Holiday marking the track from 5 or 6am till dusk (which comes rather late in Summer). LIFE MEMBERSHIP – ROGER MALCOLM



Roger's 20 year association with St George Little Athletics started in the 1982/83 season when the family joined Rangers Club. The following season Roger attained his Level 2 Long/Triple qualification and for the next three years was Long Jump Chief.

The next three years saw Roger busy cooking at the BBQ before becoming the Under 13 and the Under 14 Girls' Age Manager. At the State carnivals, which were held at Narrabeen in those days, Roger was always on a Relay change.

When his children left Little Athletics, Roger and his son Justin continued to assist each Friday night.

In 1996, Roger began the development of the computer program we still use. The 1996/97 season saw it first used and from that time to now it has been continually refined with Roger's expertise, limited only by the age of the program and the type of program.

Roger still assists the Club on Friday nights throughout the season and still takes great pride in the records his daughter Brooke still holds at St George and the achievements of our current athletes.

It is with great pleasure we award Life Membership of St George Little Athletics to Roger Malcolm.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP – LYNNE WHATMAN

Lynne and her family joined the Rangers Club of St George in the 1985/86 season. With four children competing, the first few years were as the volunteer helper - prepared to help in any way she could, helping in the field, writing out stickers, fundraising etc. When Helen Watson moved on, Lynne became the announcer, a job she did for several seasons.

As her youngest child Naomi, was showing promise as a thrower, Lynne took a greater interest in this area and in 1993 became a Level 2 Throws Judge. For the next few seasons, Lynne was the Chief Throws Judge for St George. Lynne used this and her general athletic knowledge to assist in coordinating the coaching of the new athletes to our Centre for the first six weeks of each season. After working at Zone Carnivals, then Region and finally to State Carnivals, Lynne became a qualified "B" Grade Judge. Lynne has used this expertise to officiate at State Relays, State Multi's, Trans Tasman Trials, Pacific School Games, Transplant Games as well as many school carnivals.

After St George became one Centre, Lynne was a member of the General Committee for a number of years. In the 1994/5 and 1995/96 seasons, Lynne was the Girls' Preston Team Manager, assisting in the fundraising and the organisation of the St George teams, in both Sydney and Melbourne.

Lynne has attended the last five NSW Little Athletics Annual Conferences along with other Committee members, where they gained an insight into how the Little Athletics association operated and made many ongoing contacts with other Little Athletics Clubs around NSW. The information learned was able to help the running of our Club in many ways.

When the computer program was introduced in 1996, Lynne worked with the then Recorder Rhonda Orr for two seasons to help develop the program to suit our Centre. Then in the 1998/99 season Lynne was elected as Recorder. This new program eliminated the need to write out individual stickers for every athlete's results, by printing computer generated stickers each week. This greatly increased the workload of the Recorder. Although Lynne's children had ended their Little Athletic's careers, she continued to be involved with the Club. Lynne was elected President in 2000/2001 season.

Over the past two seasons, the Club with Lynne as President, has encouraged more parents to assist at both the Friday nights and monthly Committee meetings, and also participate in wider athletic activities.

We have much pleasure in awarding Life Membership of St George Little Athletics Club to Lynne Whatman.

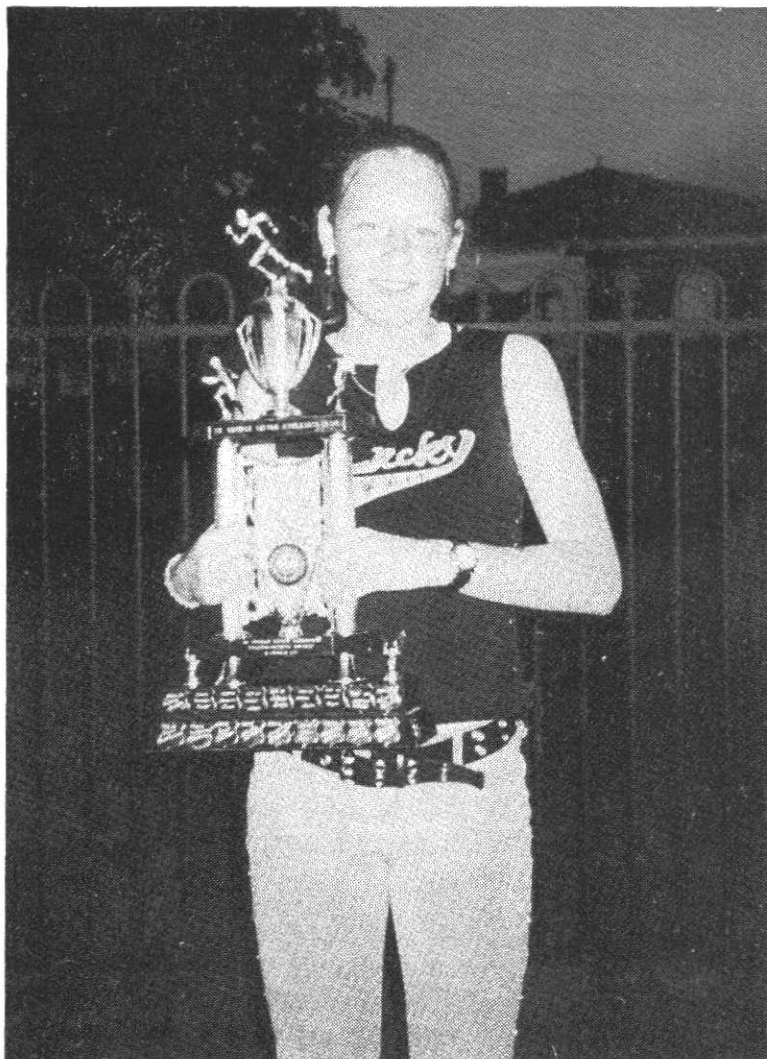

This has been a great year with many outstanding results at the State Championships.

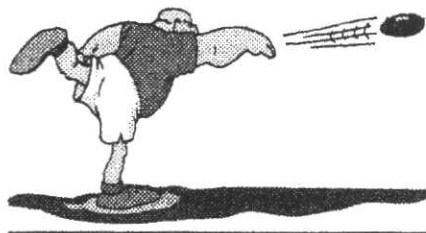
Our throwers and middle distance runners showed the benefit gained by training and competing as a group by the many personal bests throughout the season.

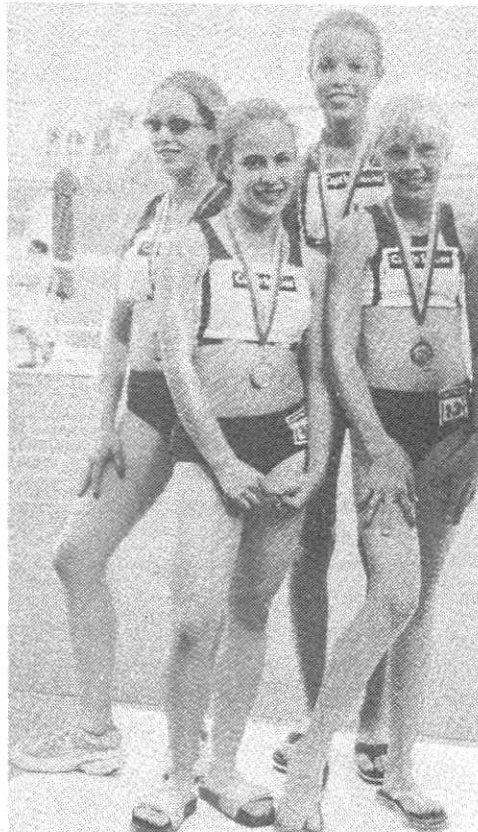

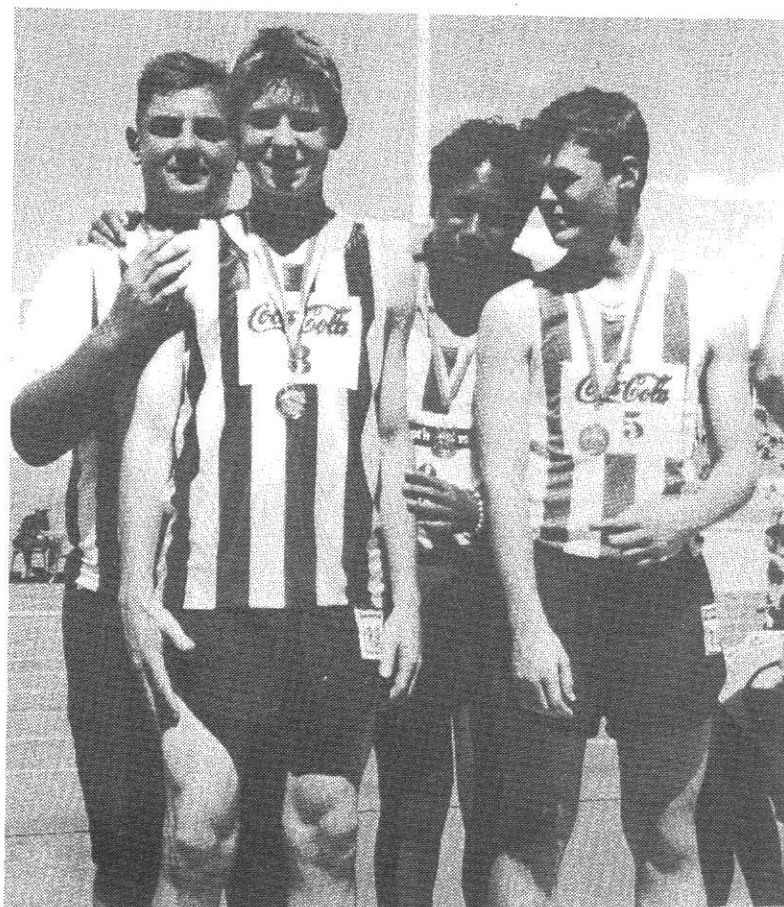

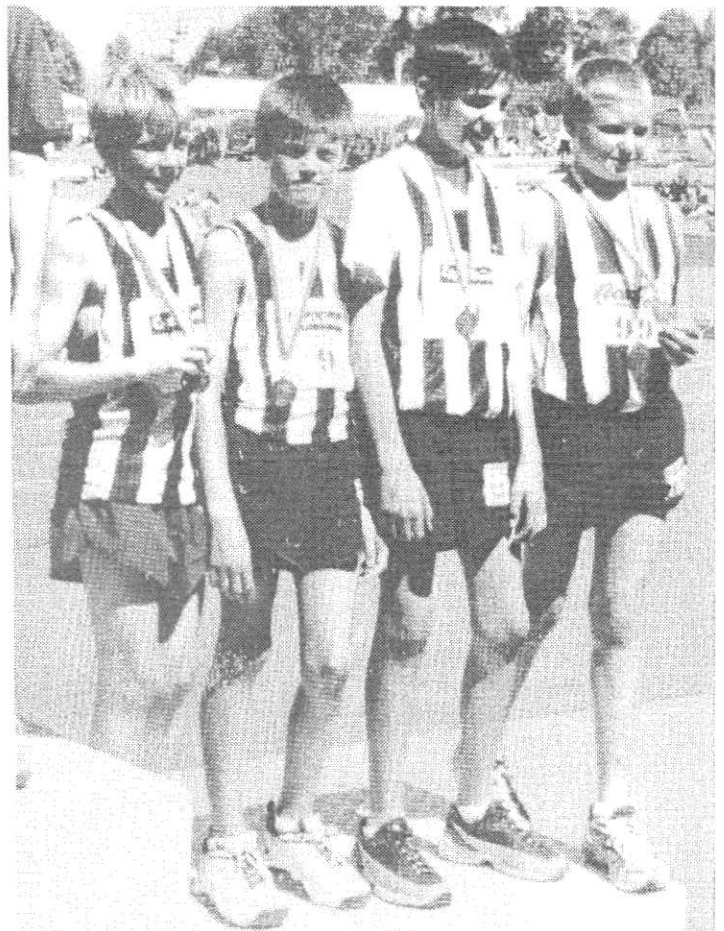
