ANNUAL REPORT AND FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Presented at the Annual General Meeting
on Tuesday 1st May, 1979.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is indeed a pleasure to present this, the Eighth Annual Report. Once again this year as in previous years, we have had some wonderful performances and in some areas we have achieved quite a lot of success.

The Centre once again conducted the St. George Primary Schools Athletic Carnival at Jubilee Oval, Kogarah, and this was to be the venue for the St. George L.A.C. meetings for the rest of the season. Unfortunately at the time of our Centre Championships we had to vacate Jubilee Oval, but I feel that a most successful Championship Meeting was held at Sylvania Waters Track and I would like to thank both Competitors and Parents for their support in the running of this Championship.

We also had the Preston-Reservoir visitors from Melbourne this year and once again this turned out to be a very successful weekend for the competitors and parents.

The Centre this year is financially better, healthier, than previous years for a couple of reasons. This year uniform and equipment replacement was not as high, and also we had the distribution of telephone books to put money back in the Bank, which we did not have in previous years.

Congratulations to the six children who made the State side to compete in the Trans Tasman Match, and to Brett Newton, selected in the N.S.W. Team to compete in Perth in May. To Mrs. Mabs Errington for her appointment again as Team Manageress.

I would like to thank the Executive for their support throughout the season.

REGISTRATIONS

In spite of various problems during the season the number of registrations were very encouraging. With a final total of 351 children, there was an increase of 59 over last year and our highest figure since 1973/4. This must prove the popularity of Friday night competition compared with Sunday afternoons. The N.S.W. Track and Field Championships were held at Narrabeen National Fitness Camp on the weekend of 24th-25th March, 1979.

The Championships were officially opened by the Prime Minister, Mr. Malcolm Fraser. It was a very proud moment for St. George, when Tim Sparkes, as Captain of the 1978 State Team, welcomed Mr. Fraser and presented him with an Association lapel badge. Mrs. Fraser was presented with a posy, by girls Team Captain, Suzanne Alton, from The Hills Centre. Tim then had the honour of escorting Mr. Fraser around the field to watch various events and meet some of the competitors and

officials.

The next day, she again took the silver medal with a great 800m, this time bettering her personal best by 10 seconds and smashing the Centre Record by 13 seconds! Another great performance came from Under 10 Christopher Knight, who, after travelling all night from Wagga, won the Long Jump with a State Record breaking leap of 4.86m. This effort made up for the disappointments Chris experienced at the Region.
