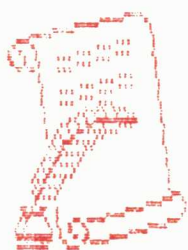

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Another season of Little Athletics is over. Hopefully, our athletes have enjoyed their involvement and will return for the 1991/92 season. That is what Little Athletics is all about and I hope that we have been able to provide the organisation and facilities to facilitate that enjoyment.

While it is difficult to measure enjoyment, we can certainly look at the achievements of the children at St. George and see that some excellent performances took place through the season, culminating in the Centre gaining second place at the State Championships in March.

Running a centre like St. George, as with most other centres, is not an easy task. Many parents, particularly those on the executive, have put in a lot of effort to enable all the activities of the centre to run so well. I would like to express my sincere thanks to all those people. My thanks also to the members of the various committees and to those parents and friends who were always willing to help out, both at centre events and other carnivals.

As President, I hope that this committee is passing to the incoming committee a centre that is in good shape and has the framework to continue as one of the leading centres in the State. Two factors that we have seen finalised should help provide part of that framework. Firstly, obtaining a grant for extensions to the building at Olds Park and secondly, introducing a rule to ensure that at least one parent from each family plays an active role in the successful operation of the centre, rather than relying on some parents to do more than their share. This matter has long been the bane of St. George and many other centres, and hopefully, the rule we have introduced will enable all members to enjoy their involvement.

I have tried not to refer to many specific people or happenings, as these will be included in the ensuing reports.

There were a number of setbacks experienced by the centre during the season, but hopefully enough has now been done to overcome them for next season. These included not having a Secretary or Coaching Co-ordinator for most, or all of the season. Another was the withdrawal of our printer just before the handbook was to be printed. This also affected our finances, as the printer arranged sponsorship to offset the printing costs. Our attempts to gain sponsorship early in the season were not successful, but we were able to gain support from St. George Masonic Club and Paul's Warehouse during the season. Hopefully, a new sponsorship programme planned for next season will be more successful.

Congratulations to our champion athletes for 1990/91, Brooke Malcolm and Clinton Pelham. The centre is lucky to have such fine ambassadors and if we have played any part in the development of these or the many other upstanding members of our centre, then our efforts have been worthwhile.

## REGISTRARS, RECORDS AND RANKINGS REPORT

Well, we have finished another successful season at St. George Little Athletics.

This season we had many new Ground and Centre Records created and congratulations to all athletes on their great performances during the season. ## REPORT OF OFFICER FOR OFFICIALS

The season saw the introduction of a significant change concerning the stickers. 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## CHAMPIONSHIPS & SPECIAL MEETINGS

This year there was no Fun Run or Gala Day held, because the committee felt that the athletes were swamped with events leading up to Christmas and those who wished to compete in Gala Days had a choice of many, including our neighbouring Little Athletic Centres.

State Relays were held at Narrabeen this year and once again St. George athletes who competed had an enjoyable, though long, day, with many teams making finals and some winning medals.

This day shows that teamwork is more important than individual brilliance in relay events.

Our Centre Championships were held in December this year to help with the selection of our team for the Zone Championships. Even though the number of competitors was lower than in previous years, those who did compete had an enjoyable day and the venue - Sylvania Waters - gave some of our younger athletes their first taste of competing on a championship track.

St. George Little Athletes were very successful at the Zone and Regional Championships, with 32 children progressing to the State Championships.

Once again, these championships showed that the St. George Centre has some of the best little athletes in the State. Although compared to previous years, the quantity of athletes had dropped, the quality, if anything, has increased. A total of 13 gold, 19 silver and 6 bronze medals were won by our athletes. Outstanding individual highlights would naturally include Clinton Pelham - 5 gold medals (4 individual and 1 relay) and an equal State record in the 100m, which he shared with Bryant Ferreira; James Barker - 3000m State record; Tony Auciello - 1500m equal State record; and Brooke Malcolm - 90m and 200m hurdles State records. Most satisfying from a Centre and collective view would have to have been the crushing performances of our two magnificent senior relay teams, who left all other Centres floundering in their wake as they swept to victory and the gold medals. Finally, all our State representatives should be very proud of themselves for their effort and behaviour over the weekend.

CHAMPION BOY - CLINTON PELHAM U/13

Clinton was placed first in all his five events at Zone, Region and State level, with a Centre Record and equal State Record in the 100m and a Centre Record in the 200m at the State Championships. Clinton received this award last year and thoroughly deserves it again this year.

CHAMPION GIRL - BROOKE MALCOLM U/15

Brooke is an example of what a Little Athlete can achieve with lots of hard work and persistence. Last season Brooke received her first State medal. This year Brooke received gold medals in the 90m, 200m and Relay; silver in the 200m and Bronze in the 100m. She now holds State and Centre records in 90m and 200m.

RUNNER-UP BOY - JAMES BARKER U/14

James is a new member of St. George Little Athletics and this season he achieved excellent results at Zone and Region. At the State Championships he was 2nd in the 1500m and first in the 3000m, when he broke both the State and Centre Records. The 3000m was open to U/13, U/14 and U/15 athletes and James as an U/14 still has another year to compete in this event.

RUNNER-UP GIRL - RACHELLE QUIGGIN U/10

At the State Championships, Rachelle won three silver medals - in the 100m, 200m and 60m. Rachelle holds Centre Records in the 100m and 60m and holds ground records in the 60m and 200m.

MIDDLE DISTANCE - TONY AUCIELLO U/15

Once again Tony has had an excellent season, gaining medals and breaking records in all middle distance events through Zone, Region and State. At the State Championships he won gold in the 1500m, silver in 3000m and bronze in the 800m.

ENCOURAGEMENT BOY - LUKE STEPHENSON U/13

Luke was placed in four events at Zone and at the Regional Championships he was placed 5th in the 800m and 4th in the 1500m.

ENCOURAGEMENT GIRL - DEBRA NELSON U/10

Debbie qualified for four events at Region - 400m, 60m, 800m and discus. Debbie made the final eight in all her events, with her best being a 4th place in 60m.

MULTI AWARD - LUKE STUART U/14

Luke is another new St. George member, who was placed 2nd at this year's State Multi Event at Goulburn. He was also placed in three events at the State Championships, with a gold medal and a centre record in the Triple Jump, a silver in the Long Jump, and 7th in the High Jump.

FIELD AWARD - BELINDA OTTO U/15

This is a new award this year and it goes to a girl who has performed well and has broken records in field events over the past few seasons and this year at the State Championships she received a silver medal for the Long Jump.

## STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS 1990/91

Once again these championships showed that the St. George centre has some of the best little athletes in the State. Although compared to previous years the quantity of athletes had dropped, the quality, if anything, has increased. A total of 13 gold, 19 silver and 6 bronze medals were won by our athletes.
